The Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 will create new rights to walk on 'access land' – generally mountain, moor, heath, down and registered common land. The Countryside Agency is producing maps which show where you will be able to walk.

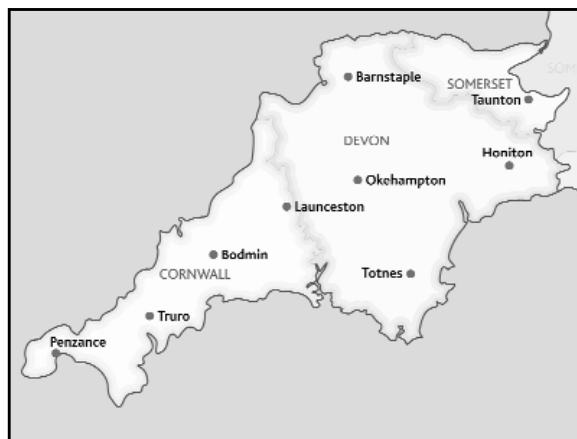
The draft map for southwest England will be issued on 13 May 2003 and is available to comment on until 13 August 2003.
